

ACHARYA HARIHARA

An Illustrious Personality



[1878 – 1971]

Acharya Harihar Das was born in 1878 in Sriramchandrapur village of Sakhigopal, a freedom fighter from Odisha, participated in Salt Satyagraha and jailed during British Rule in 1930 as a true disciple of Gandhiji. After independence he joined "Bhoodan Movement" of Vinoba jee.

He was one of the member of 'Modern Panchasakha' of Odisha, others being Utkalmani Gopabandhu Das, Pandit Nilakantha Das, Pandit Krupasindhu Mishra and Pandit Godabarish Mishra. Together they contributed under the able leadership of Utkal Gourav Madhusudan Das for the formation of special Odisha Province basing on the mother tongue 'Odiaa' in 1936 during the British Era. He was also the editor of the 'Odiaa' newspaper , the Samaj.

Besides, he was a renowned teacher (Acharya) at Satyabadi open air school at Sakhigopal, Puri during British Era and loved by all his students. The basic objectives of Satyabadi school was to inculcate the sense of Nationalism among the masses by uniting all irrespective of caste, creed and religion. He was preaching "Be a good man" (Bhala Manisha Hua) to all his students. This great patriot and "Acharya" passed away in 21st February 1971 at the age of 93 Years.

From the Desk of the Director....

The year 2021-22, like the previous year, was marred by the second & third waves of the pandemic. The Delta variant was particularly severe, but since our system was firmly in place, we could handle the situation without gross disruption of the services. All the service parameters showed upward trends as compared to 2020-21, but less than that of 2019-20. Despite the adversities, the infrastructural developmentprocess continued. The CT & MRI services under PPP mode were dedicated to people by Hon'ble Chief Minister on the 14th July 2021. Besides that, construction of the all the 6 floors over the LINAC was completed; construction of new bunkers expeditated; pathology department was modernized with installation of new equipment and introduction of Immuno-histochemistry studies; a new operation room was added to the four existing ones to ease out the waiting time; the registration counter was expanded & modernized. The new Byelaws of AHPGIC was approved by Governing Body after due approval by the Government and registration was also renewed. It was published in the special edition of Odisha Gazette. So on the whole the progress continued un-abetted despite the adverse situation.

With ease of pandemic by January 2022, it is expected that the year 2022-23 will see a better future for the Institute. New faculty & paramedical selections are in the offing. Installation of PETCT, new LINACs, a 20 bedded ICU, increase of bed strength from 281 to 507 and further expansion of AHPGIC under SCB redevelopment plans are targeted for this year.

I see a very bright future for the Institute. With world class infrastructure and quality manpower, there is no reason why we can't match the international standards.

I congratulate my team for their tireless service to our beneficiaries.

REPORT OF THE DEAN AND PRINCIPAL

Our Institute has been approved by the NMC / MCI as the first Post-graduate Medical College of our State, without MBBS course, from the academic year 2017-18. To start with the Post-graduate students have been admitted in 2017 Super speciality Courses i.e **Surgical Oncology** and **Gynaecological Oncology** and two batches of M.Ch students have passed out in 2020 and 2021. We are pursuing to start more Post-graduate courses in other specialities and super specialities.



I. Post-Graduate Medical Education:

(a) FIRST BATCH M.Ch COURSE COMPLETED (2017-2020) :

Two students each in the subject M.Ch. (Gynaecological Oncology and Surgical Oncology) have taken admission in the academic year 2017-18 and they have successfully passed out in August 2020. These courses have been recognised by National Medical Commission (Formerly MCI) on dated 17.09.2020.

(b) SECOND BATCH M.Ch COURSE COMPLETED (2018-2021) :

Two students each in the subject M.Ch. (Gynaecological Oncology and Surgical Oncology) have taken admission in the academic year 2018-19 and they have successfully passed out in July 2021. These courses have been recognised by National Medical Commission (NMC).

(c) ONGOING PG COURSE: (ADMISSION DURING (2019-20) Third Batch:

Two students each in the subject M.Ch. (Gynaecological Oncology and Surgical Oncology) have taken admission in the academic year 2019-20. The teaching and training programme of the PG students are going on as per the syllabus approved by the Utkal University.

(d) ONGOINGPG COURSE (ADMISSION DURING ACADEMIC YEAR 2020-21) Fourth Batch:

Two students each in the subject M.Ch. (Gynaecological Oncology and Surgical Oncology) have taken admission in the academic year 2020-21. The teaching and training programme of the PG students are going on as per the syllabus approved by the Utkal University.

(e) PG COURSE TO START (DURING ACADEMIC YEAR 2022-23)

This year we have been permitted by Govt. of Odisha to apply to National Medical Commission (NMC) to open PG Course in Anaesthesiology, Head & Neck Oncology and Onco-Pathology.

(f) Ongoing PG course in MD (Radiation Oncology) during Academic Year 2020-21 : Six students have taken admission during the academic year 2020-21 under the control of the Dean & Principal, SCB Medical College, Cuttack and continuing their study at AHPGIC, Cuttack.

II. Diploma in Medical Laboratory Technology (DMLT):

(a) First Batch of DMLT COURSE COMPLETED :

The first batch, nineteen students, have taken admission during the academic year 2017-18. Eighteen out of nineteen students have successfully passed the DMLT Course and completed their internship training in March 2021.

(b) ADMISSION DURING 2018-19. Second Batch:

The second batch, nineteen students, have taken admission during the academic year 2018-19. They have appeared the final Board examination.



(c) ADMISSION DURING 2019-20. Third Batch:

The third batch, twenty students, have taken admission during the academic year 2019-20. The teaching and training programme of the DMLT students are going on as per the DMLT council guideline of Government of Odisha.

(d) ADMISSION DURING 2020-21. FourthBatch:

The fourth batch, seventeen students, have taken admission during the academic year 2020—21. The teaching and training programme of the DMLT students are going on as per the DMLT council guideline of Government of Odisha.

ACADEMICS & RESEARCH

Acharya Harihar Post Graduate Institute of Cancer (AHPGIC), Cuttack is marching forward with its PG Courses, M.Ch. (Gynaecological Oncology), M.Ch. (Surgical Oncology), MD (Radiation Oncology), DMLT, DRTT and COTT courses to produce qualified human resources to serve the cancer patient of our country and abroad. The Medical Physics course has been started at NISER, Khordha with our technical support from this year. A department of pulmonary medicine created. Clinical training for B.Sc. Nursing/Post Basic Nursing/M.Sc. Nursing students available

Research is an integral segment of medical education and patient care. Institutional Ethics Committee of the centre conducts meetings at regular intervals for review and approval of new research work to be performed. Several Govt. and industry sponsored intra-mural and extra-mural research works are being conducted in the institution resulting in good amount of publications in premier journals of national and international repute.

Library Committee supervises the maintenance and development of AHPGIC central library and elibrary. Postgraduate committee monitors PG & M.Ch. education as well as inter departmental and inter institutional academic activities. Hotsel Committee looks after the day to day affairs of both ladies and gents hostel for residential doctors.

Hospital Based Cancer Registry & Patterns of Care & Survival Studies in Cancer Cervix, Cancer Breastand Head & Neck Cancers (HBCR-POCSS) project under National Cancer Registry Programme is working in the centre. Similarly the centre is enrolled in National Cancer Grid network. The NCG was created to form a union of cancer centres in the country which could provide uniform and high standards of cancer care, follow uniform evidence based guidelines for management of patients, develop human resource adequately trained to fulfill the cancer healthcare needs of the entire nation and conduct a collaborative clinical research of high standard.

Tumor board is conducted every day for discussion and decision of treatment protocols for new patients consisting of specialists of each segment.

AHPGIC undertakes trainings and courses for medical doctors, nurses, paramedical staff and students to build additional manpower in the field of oncology.

NIRAMAYA

The drug ware house is functioning for storing and management of Anticancer drugs for the whole state and NIRAMAYA is able to fulfill 100% demand for both general and anti cancer drugs.

Telemedicine

Telemedicine centre is a great help for cancer patients of different districts minimizing the long distance travel to the centre. This is also being utilized for tele-conferencing with premier institutes for academic discussions and meetings. This service became the best support for the patients during the lockdown due to Covid-19 pandemic outbreak. Now the E-sanjivanee application is being successfully implemented with the help of telemedicine infrastructure.

Community Activity

AHPGIC is actively engaged in the community service in the form of cancer education, consultation and early detection through camps and various media across the state. Social Workers-cum-counselors of different NGOs have been deployed for patient assistance.

Hospital Information Management System

O-eHMIS project of CDAC,NOIDA is under process of customization and testing for competition of Hospital information Management System at AHPGIC. Several modules are live and working successfully.

Infrastructure

Construction of G + 6 building is complete for operationalization of increased hospital bed strength to 507. New advanced Brachytherapy has been started and two new LINAC and PET-CT will be started soon. One Oxygen plant from PM Care Fund has been installed.

PALLIATIVE MEDICINE

This unit provides prompt pain relief and palliative care through different modalities of services & immediate management of pain to patients at any stage of the disease (mostly terminally ill) with an intention for an improved quality of life. The services provided here have managed to garner recognition throughout different region which is reflected through the influx of patients from various government and private medical colleges & hospitals of eastern India.

IAPC certification courses are being conducted in 2 sessions in a year for all doctors, nurses, volunteers and social workers at the centre.

Our centre, being the State Nodal Centre for Palliative Care, coordinates with the 30 satellite centres established at district headquarter hospitals of the state, to offer Palliative treatment. There is a plan to strengthen this department by creating separate faculty post, thereby opening PG course in Palliative Medicine.

MOU with Bagchi-Karunashraya has been signed for home based palliative care free of cost in the state.

GYNAECOLOGICAL ONCOLOGY

Gynecological Oncology deals with female cancer patients for prevention, palliation, early diagnosis and prompt adequate treatment. Departmental library has more than 100 books and periodicals for education and research purpose. A state level training on Pap Smear screening was conducted by the Department in collaboration with Department of Pathology for O&G Specialists of different districts. State level project on HPV self collection and treatment of screened positive cases are being done by the department. Department Organizes the Cervical cancer eradication day on 11th March every year. Felicitation and oration was delivered by Dr. Jim Bentley of Canada. Public awareness programmes are being done with priority.

The main activities of this department are:

- o Diagnosis and treatment of female genital tract malignancies
- o Diagnosis of premalignant lesions and its proper treatment
- Routine screening of female population for early diagnosis of cancer cervix amongst the patients attending the outdoor of the centre
- Assisting in Mobile Cancer Detection Camps for screening of patients
- o Teaching and training of M.Ch. students
- o Training of Post-graduate students, in-service doctors and Para-medical workers
- Training in Gynecologic Oncology of post- PG faculties

HEAD & NECK ONCOLOGY

Oral cancer is one of the 10 most common cancers of the world and the commonest in India. There is excellent evidence from many sources that approximately 90% of these cancers are due to tobacco abuse in any form and poor oral & dental hygiene. Almost 70% - 80% of the cases reported have advanced stage of cancer which is practically in Stage-III & IV. Cancers of the Thyroid gland, parotid gland and minor salivary glands are also frequently reported in this Dept. The incidence of pre-malignant lesions like leukoplakia and sub-mucous fibrosis has increased considerably. Cosmetic value being a vital factor, various reconstructive procedures is being performed by this department. The



post- graduate students, Paramedical staffs and exservice doctors are imparted regular training programs keeping in view the early detection, prevention and treatment of Head & Neck cancers as the main theme.

Medical Oncology department has an important role in the management of cancer cases. The main function of this division is to provide treatment care for the patients suffering from wide range of malignant neoplasms especially for haematological malignancies, lymphoma and solid neoplasms by chemotherapy as primary mode, concurrent mode (CT/RT), neo-adjuvant before RT/Surgery or adjuvant mode following RT/ Surgery.

The faculties of Medical Oncology teach & guide the Radio Therapy PG students on Chemotherapy.

The doctors and Paramedics of different districts are trained on Daycare Chemotherapy in regular interval under Dept. of Medical Oncology who renders service to follow up cancer patients in all DHHs of Odisha.

Department of Medical Oncology has a Pediatric Oncology Wing for pediatric patients coming to the centre. The ten bedded Sovan Bhuyan Memorial Day Care Unit is serving under the department for the patients receiving chemotherapy on day care basis.

MEDICAL PHYSICS

The Department of Medical Physics ensures implementation of the provisions of the Radiation Protection Rules (RPR)-2004 enforced by the Atomic Energy Regulatory Board (AERB), Government of India with the following responsibilities:

- o Evaluation and optimization of Radiation treatment planning for cancer patients undergoing radiation therapy.
- Performing radiation dosimetry, periodic calibrations, quality assurance (QA) testing traceable to national standards laboratory and maintenance of all the radiotherapeutic and radiodiagnostic equipments / machines.
- Observing radiation safety for the radiation workers, staff members, patients and public in the Departments of Radiation Oncology, Radiodiagnosis, Nuclear Medicine and Medical Physics.
- o Participating in various research and developmental activities of the centre.
- Facility design and Planning for commissioning of new radiation installations and decommissioning of old installations in accordance with the

requirements of the installation that meets the regulatory stipulations of radiation protection and safety.

- o Preparations of specifications for treatment and dosimetric equipment;
- Acceptance testing, commissioning and quality assurance (including calibration) of radiation facilities.
- o Measurement, analysis and tabulation of beam data for clinical use.
- Development of Q A protocols and procedures in radiation therapy regarding delivery of radiation treatment, radiation safety and control and regulatory supervision of radiation therapy equipment servicing and maintenance of records.
- Teaching Radiation Physics to the PG students for MD (Radiation Oncology) degree and the DMRT (Dip. in Medical Radiation Technology) students of SCB Medical College, Cuttack.

RADIATION ONCOLOGY

This department treats about 200 patients daily using telecobalt therapy and HDR brachytherapy. About 65% of all cancer patients attending this institute avail radiation therapy during their course of treatment. External Beam therapy is delivered by one telecobalt units (Theratron-780C) from 8:00 AM to late night in three shifts on all working days. Multiple-fields, wedge, block and tangential fields at 80cm SSD are practiced as required. Now the department is well equipped with Linear Accelerator and CT Simulator. More than thousand patients were treated successfully with most sophisticated treatment modalities like VMAT and IMRT. PG - studies in radiotherapy leading to MD (RT) is available in this institute since 1973. Six PG students admit every year for their MD degree. Post graduate seminars are organized twice a month.

SURGICAL ONCOLOGY

Surgical oncology is one of the important departments of the cancer centre. Usually all the new patients coming to the center are first seen in the Surgical Oncology OPD and after getting the tissue or cytological diagnosis and evaluation for operability both clinically and radiologically, those patients are taken for surgical admission and operations. Inoperable cases detected either clinically or radiologically are referred for other modality of treatments like chemotherapy and or radiotherapy.

Modified radical mastectomy, Breast conservation surgeries, radical gastric resections, Abdomino Perineal Resection of rectal cancers are few of those surgeries being done routinely. Radical as well as conservative surgeries for cancer penis are also done frequently. Many

a times palliative and bypass surgeries are being done to alleviate pain and agony, Oesophago- gastrectomy, Whipples procedures are been done less frequently. Wide local excision of soft tissue cancers are also being done in routine basis along with reconstructive procedures. One reconstructive surgeon is working full time but on deputation basis from civil hospital. A fulltime faculty in plastic and reconstructive surgery is badly needed for this department. Post-graduate students from the department of Surgery, SCB Medical College, Cuttack are undertaking training on rotation. They are getting much better exposure and benefit as more than 50% of cases in their examination period are oncology subject. We need to get more and more support from the HOD Surgery from SCB Medical college, Cuttack in this regard posting them on rotation and also for at least 3 months instead of 1 month. Surgeons from peripheral health services are also undergoing re- orientation training in surgical technique on rotation basis. This reorientation program for the peripheral surgeons needs to be on a more regular basis which is not the fact now. The departmental seminar is being conducted regularly. The faculties have also delivered many guest lecturers, presented papers in conferences and taken part in various symposia and workshops. Faculties have regularly taking part in early cancer detection and educational programs joining the cancer control camps and various awareness programs. M.Ch. in Surgical Oncology is continuing from 2017.
